Minutes of the Radnor Township Board of Trustees

August 24, 2020

The Radnor Township Board of Trustees met on Monday, August 24, 2020 at 7:00 PM at the Radnor Community Center.

Those present were: Teresa Watkins, Dave Weber, Dan Boysel, Bob Fish, Todd Coonfare, Katarina Wheeland, Jennifer Way-Young of the Delaware General Health District, Jay Sell and Marc Hollinger from Aspen Energy, and Ken Fryman, Joe Preston and Bill Thompson representing the Radnor Heritage Society.

Teresa called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the July 27, 2020 meeting were read. Dan moved to approve the July 27, 2020 meeting minutes and Dave seconded.

Joe Preston, representing the Radnor Heritage Society, reported to the Board of Trustees that Radnor Historic Museum has a significant amount of moisture in the museum and it is beginning to damage artifacts in the basement. The Heritage Society is asking the Trustees to help remedy the moisture in the basement. The Board of Trustees agreed to look into finding a temporary solution until a permanent solution is secured.

Jennifer Way-Young updated the Board of Trustees that materials purchased with the grant monies for the recycling area arrived and will need to be installed soon.

Jay Sell and Marc Hollinger from Aspen Energy offered assistance to the Board of Trustees with the aggregation agreement that ends in May 2021 with Energy Harbor. They are willing to locate other suppliers to bring to the table in order to find the best supplier for Radnor Township. Jay and Marc will return on September 28.

Bob notified the Trustees that he and Randy Butts met online with Rosenbauer regarding the newly purchased fire engine and things are moving along. Bob also stated that the tanker truck is out of service due to a leak.

Todd reported to the Board of Trustees that the maintenance department recently purchased a trimmer and weed eater. He also notified the Trustees that they have been working on edging Township roads, as well as filling potholes. Lastly, Todd announced that a large tree in the cemetery fell down and requested that other trees be looked at to prevent more from falling down.

Dan reviewed his notes from the tour of the township roads taken Friday August 24th and suggested the Board of Trustees meet to discuss which roads they plan to tackle first in 2021 when the township begins to receive monies from the Road Levy. The Trustees agreed to discuss the roads at the next meeting on Monday September 14, 2020 at 7:00PM.

Dave reported on the progress for culvert and tile work being done on Byers Road and River Road and stated that he will contact the company for an update.

Teresa informed her fellow Trustees that she received a petition from Zaino Law Group regarding closing off an alleyway on the property located at 3238 Radnor Road.

Teresa requested that the Board of Trustees re-establish the Park Committee and set a date for their first meeting. The meeting has been set for Thursday October 1, 2020 at 7:00PM.

Finally, Teresa notified the Trustees of a property in Radnor that the township could possibly take over. The Ramsey's property on Curtis Rd keeps flooding and the landowners wish for FEMA to purchase the land and deed it to Radnor Township, who will then keep the space as an open area. The project could cost up to \$10,000 but may be offset with grants. The Trustees opted to go forward with the idea in order to see how it plays out.


