## Minutes of the Radnor Township Board of Trustees

May 26, 2020

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The Radnor Township Board of Trustees met on Tuesday, May 26, 2020 at 7:00 PM at the Radnor Community Center.

Those present were: Teresa Watkins, Dave Weber, Dan Boysel, Randy Butts, Bob Fish, and Katarina Wheeland. Township residents Jeremy Fryman and his mother, Ms. Fryman, and Eric Renner, along with Doug Riedel of the Delaware County Engineer's Office, were also present.

Teresa called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the April 27, 2020 meeting were read. Dan moved to approve the April 27, 2020 meeting minutes and Dave seconded.

Jeremy Fryman requested assistance from the Township to encourage the Delaware County Engineers Office to come look at the drainage and flooding issues created by heavy rainfall on his mother's property, located at 3356 Radnor Rd. The issue has been present for a few years and continues to worsen. The Fryman's have tried to contact the county without success. Doug Riedel from DCE attested that he would look into the drainage issue and have more information at the next Radnor Township Board of Trustees meeting in June.

Eric Renner, resident at 3434 Gallant Rd., spoke about the drainage issue on his property. Eric requested assistance from the Board of Trustees to help with the road ditch in order to ease the amount of standing water in his yard. Dave volunteered to take a look at the ditch and report back to the Trustees.

Doug Riedel, from the Delaware County Engineer's Office, announced some OPWC projects that were to be funded have now been canceled for 2020. This may include the joint project with Marlboro Township on N Section Line Rd. Doug recommended three possible options for Radnor Township for 2021: 1. Go in with Troy Township on Hills Miller Rd. 2. Go in with Marlboro Township on N Section Line Rd. and 3. Revisit River Rd. as our own project. Doug notified the Board the REA for OPWC deadline is Friday, May 29, 2020. Dan motioned to support all three projects, Dave seconded. All ayes. Dave had the REA form on hand, the Trustees all signed and Doug took the form to be submitted.

Randy reported to the Board of Trustees that Ohio Emergency Management Agency (EMA) will be providing PPE to Delaware County, who will in turn offer supplies to townships. The allocation is based off EMA funding and Radnor Township should receive approximately 50 face masks to be used for Township government business.

Randy notified the Trustees he met with a salesperson from Rosenbauer regarding the purchase of a new fire engine. Bob Fish received a proposal that is approximately \$608,000 to \$617,000. Once they finalize the design of the new truck, Rosenbauer will offer a firm quote which will be presented at the next Board of Trustees meeting in June.

Bob advised the Board of Trustees on potholes needed to be filled on River Rd. between Dildine Rd. and Radnor Rd. Teresa will notify Todd.

Bob requested clarification on overtime pay for the firefighters who worked on Memorial Day this year. The board agreed the employees who worked on Memorial Day at the firehouse would be paid Holiday pay.

Dan reported he received a quote from SEPA, a manufacturer of solar lighting, for several options to provide electricity to the flagpole located at the old Radnor School grounds. The quotes ranged from \$4,700 to \$4,800. Dan mentioned a second option of running a line from the meter at the Radnor Baseball field to the flagpole; the cost associated with this option would be installation, approximately \$5,000 and we would have the option to install extra outlets at the ball fields and shelter house. Dan will get an estimate for the second option and the Board of Trustees decided if the quote was no more than \$5,000, to proceed with the work.


Dave updated the Board of Trustees he has contacted the man responsible for doors for the Historical Society building; there is no date yet for the installation.


Teresa provided the Board of Trustees with an example agenda. The Trustees discussed and agreed upon using an agenda for meetings. Fiscal Officer will be responsible for gathering agenda items prior to meeting, as well as asking for additions and/or corrections to the agenda at the start of the meeting.

The Board of Trustees determined that due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the regularly scheduled meeting for June 8, 2020 will be cancelled and the next meeting of the Radnor Township Board of Trustees will be Monday, June 22, 2020 at 7:00 PM.

There being no further business, Dan moved to adjourn and Dave seconded.
