Minutes of the Radnor Township Board of Trustees

September 23, 2019

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The Radnor Township Board of Trustees met on Monday, September 23, 2019 at 7:00 PM at the Radnor Community Center.

Those present were Dan Boysel, Teresa Watkins, Doug Riedel from the Delaware County Engineer's Office, Eric Renner, Randy Butts, Todd Coonfare and John Coonfare.

Dan called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the September 9, 2019 meeting were read. Teresa moved to approve the September 9, 2019 meeting minutes and Dan seconded.

Mr. Renner advised the Board of Trustees that residents of Gallant Road were planning a neighborhood Halloween Party for Sunday, October 27 and desired to know of any restrictions regarding such gathering. There being none, the Board of Trustees advised Mr. Renner to contact the Delaware County Sheriff and to erect signage notifying the motoring public of increased pedestrian traffic during the event.

Mr. Renner expressed concerns regarding drainage issues near his property located at 3434 Gallant Road. Most issues in the area are the result of the elevation of driveway pipes in relation to the existing ditch. A Request for Engineering Assistance will be submitted to the Delaware County Engineer to study the ditch and driveway culverts most affected by the current drainage issues.

The Board of Trustees determined that Trick-or-Treat will be Thursday, October 31 from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM in Radnor Township.

Mr. Riedel addressed the Request for Engineering Assistance for culvert tile on Curren Road and the adjacent field tile of a private resident. Based on the existing drainage in the area, Mr. Riedel suggested that the field tile be extended to the ditch along Curren Road so that the culvert tile could accommodate drainage from the field.

Mr. Riedel reviewed the Township's fact sheet for the upcoming road levy. Based on the Township's requirements of funds for road improvement and maintenance, he suggested the fact sheet provide information to voters focusing on those needs. Teresa requested specific information for the voters regarding road repair and maintenance costs, as well as historical data pertaining to recent cost increases.

Todd advised the Board of Trustees that the International truck was at Bauerle Automotive for preventative maintenance.

Dan reported that he had received a complaint from a Township resident concerning noise and specifically a barking dog. The Township has a noise ordinance and it will be reviewed and provided to the resident as a possible source for resolution to the situation.

The Board of Trustees were presented with Resolution #12-19. Resolution #12-19 authorizes the sale of Township owned computer equipment pursuant to ORC 505.10(A)(2). The Board of Trustees own computer equipment, which includes a Dell Optiplex 9010 Computer, a Dell B2360dn Printer, Dell Monitor and related accessories. The equipment is not needed for public use, is obsolete or is unfit for the use for which it was intended. The Board of Trustees have established that the value of the equipment is \$1.00 and wishes to sell the equipment to the Radnor Heritage Society. Dan moved to adopt Resolution #12-19 and Teresa seconded.

Based on a scheduling conflict, the Board of Trustees determined that the regularly scheduled meeting for October 14 be changed to Monday, October 7, 2019 at 7:00 PM.

There being no further business, Teresa moved to adjourn and Dan seconded.
