

FIRE DEPARTMENT REORGANIZATION

The trustees are evaluating next steps in the long-term organization of the department as the requirements of the department and the township continues to grow.

OEMA RADNOR TWP PROJECT

In 2022, the Ohio Emergency Management Agency (OEMA) and Radnor Township entered into an agreement to mitigate damage to a residence which lies in a flood plain area. The project is grant funded by the provisions of the Stafford Act and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) with no direct expense to the township. The designated property is on Curtis Road within the Township.

The final demolition of the structures on site is set for the end of 2024. This property will then be designated for uses such as open space, recreational, or wetlands.

ROAD UPDATE

This has been yet another busy season as we look forward to completing another year of the 5-year road plan.

Buttermilk Hill Road was improved through a grant provided by the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC). This project was also supported by Delaware County and the Roadway Grant Assistance Program which matches every township dollar spent with three dollars. These grants allowed Radnor Township's section of Buttermilk Hill Road to be repayed for under \$20,000 of township funds!

Other road improvement projects in 2024 have included North Section Line, River, Watkins, Jones, and Curren Road.
